OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE November 24th, 2024

On the last Sunday of the Church's liturgical year, we think of the end and of judgment. The apocalyptic vision from the Book of Daniel sets the tone (First Reading). It talks about the coming of a "son of man," a title for the future redeemer. It is not clear that Jesus referred to Himself as "Son of Man" in this apocalyptic sense, but the early Christians certainly did. Basing itself on this same text from Daniel, the Book of Revelation looks to Jesus' coming at the end of time, when He will take full possession of His Kingdom (Second Reading). The Gospel, where the Lectionary once again shifts to St. John, contains a section from the Passion narrative: Jesus is being interrogated by Pilate. And the issue here is the nature of Jesus' kingship. Hail Christ the King!

History of the Catholic Church (#51) – However, over and above sheer political preponderance, Rome enjoyed certain attributes that raised it above all the other churches and destined it for a unique role as a center of Church unity. First, it could claim special status as the see of the Apostles Peter and Paul. St. Irenaeus cited Rome as the preeminent example of his principle of apostolic succession: "When the Blessed Apostles (Peter and Paul) had founded and built up the Church, they handed over the ministry of the Episcopate to Linus." Therefore, St. Irenaeus concluded, all the other churches should agree with Rome as an unquestioned channel of pure apostolic doctrine. Second, as the capital of the Empire, it attracted churchmen of rival schools of thought who were extremely desirous of having the support of the Bishop of Rome. Third, it became a very wealthy community, noted for its munificent charity; its willingness to be of assistance to other churches around the world considerably enhanced its influence.
