THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 17th, 2024

The First Reading is part of a vision of the prophet Daniel concerning the end of time. It is remarkable because it contains the earliest statement of belief in the resurrection of the dead, and the first mention in the Bible of everlasting life. In the Gospel we have part of St. Mark's Eschatological Discourse (13:1-37). Mark's account is coloured by what has already happened, for example, the persecution of the disciples in synagogues and before governors and kings. He believed that the parousia was imminent – a belief common among the early Christians. The precise time of the end is known only to God. Therefore, the disciples must not allow themselves to be misled by claims or speculations that the end is near but must maintain a constant watchfulness and readiness. The purpose of the Lord's glorious coming will not be to execute judgment yet but first to gather His elect. While we cannot share St. Marks' view that the end is near, we do share his faith in God's victory in Christ (Christ the King – next Sunday!). And, for each of us, the parousia will be our meeting with the Son of Man when we pass out of this life into eternal life.

History of the Catholic Church (#50) – Gradually certain churches assumed authority over other churches (communities). Some of them acquired so-called metropolitan status, which elevated them over the churches of a province, while others – Rome, Alexandria, and Antioch, to be specific – acquired suprametropolitan status, by which they exercised a primacy over these metropolitan churches. Political factors were mainly responsible for these differentiations, the political preponderance of a town inevitably securing its ecclesiastical preponderance. So the bishop of the capital of a Roman province was granted a certain superiority over the other bishops of that province; he had the right to convoke synods and to preside over the debates. The fourth canon of the Council of Nicaea (325) officially sanctioned this principle when it recognized the primacy of Rome, Alexandria, and Antioch.
