## THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2024

By rabbinical count, the Law consisted of some 613 commandments. The Scribe's question as to which commandment was the greatest was one frequently discussed among the rabbis. Jesus was asked to name one, but responded by naming two. Both are found in the Old Testament; the first in Deuteronomy 6:4 (First Reading), the second in Leviticus 19:18. What Jesus did was to put the two together, thus emphasising the essential relatedness of them. No rabbi had previously done this. The emphasis on love became for Christians the identifying characteristic of their religion. The scribe agreed fully with Jesus, and went on to declare that true love of God and the loving service of others are more important than elaborate cult. Nowhere else in the Gospels does a scribe emerge in such a favorable light.

History of the Catholic Church (#48) – The third means used by the Church to uphold its authority and safeguard orthodoxy was by the formulation of a creed, the "rule of faith," a compendium of the main teachings of the bishops. The earliest example of such a rule is found in the writings of St. Irenaeus. It asserts the Church's faith in one God, the Father and Creator of all things; in the incarnation of God in Christ Jesus; and in the Holy Sprit, through whom the prophets were inspired to foretell the salvation events connected with the ministry of Jesus Christ. In this threefold manner – through bishops claiming to be successors of the Apostles, through a Canon of Scripture, and through an authoritative creed – the Church erected a durable structure of authority, a framework of steel that has enable it to meet every conceivable crisis.

<u>PARENTING TIP OF THE MONTH</u> – On November 1st the Church celebrates the feast of All Saints. On that day, we celebrate with all those who have died and are now with God in heaven. There are many saints and those we are named after are our patron saints. In a world in need of positive and faithful mentors for our children, saints fit the need. November is a great month to explore the lives of saints each family members is named after, or saints who your children might be curious about, perhaps names of other relatives. Talk about how saints lives were not always easy, but they did good and difficult things because they trusted and loved God.
