SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME January 19th, 2025

The First Reading contains a message of hope for God's people at one of the lowest moments in their history – Jerusalem lay in ruins. The city's plight reflected that of the nation as whole. Israel, once God's bride, was now like a widow bereft of children. However, her husband, God, has not forgotten her. There will be a new wedding feast, and God and His people will be like newlyweds again. This prophecy was fulfilled in Jesus, who replaced the old order with the new. This is symbolised by the changing of water into wine (Gospel Reading). The miracle of Cana links this Sunday with the feast of the Epiphany and with Jesus's Baptism – all are epiphanies of His glory. St. John depicts Mary as involved at the beginning of Jesus' ministry, and again at the end of it when she is present at the foot of the cross. Mary is thus associated with the whole of His ministry. But her role must always be seen in relation to that of her Son.

The fact that so many of them even held high posts in the government and the army aggravated the offense.
